## HONORABLE MENTION

### Kelsey Dawson, UNC Asheville

Kelsey Dawson scored three goals for UNC Asheville in the Bulldogs' 4-2 over Campbell Saturday afternoon. She scored her first goal in the first half and then scored her last two goals in the second half to break a 2-2 tie and give the Bulldogs their first ever win over Campbell in three tries.

### Kate Schabo, Elon

Kate Schabo, a junior forward from Worthington, Ohio, notched a hat-trick in a 5-2 romp over Rider. The first came at the 13:26 mark on assists from Denise Rogers and Jessica Mills. Schabo scored again at the 18:25 mark on assists from Shelley Stenzel and Angie Beckett. Schabo scored again in the 85th minute to complete the scoring for the Phoenix.

## AROUND THE LEAGUE

**YOUTH IS SERVED**--BSC has fielded perhaps one of the youngest squads in the NCAA as the Panthers list 14 freshmen on their roster of 26 players. Add a couple of sophomore newcomers, a transfer and Hannah Rulewicz, who did not play last season after playing for BSC in 2000, and the Panthers have a total of 18 players that did not play at BSC last season.

**WILSON SHINING IN GOAL**--Freshman keeper Miki Wilson is off to a very solid beginning as CSU's mainstay in goal. In three games, Wilson has a 1.19 GAA and has recorded 18 saves. She has allowed four goals in three games this season.

**FISHER, DOTEN PACE LADY CHANTS**--CCU is currently 2-1-1 on the season, which is the best start for the Lady Chants in its three year existence. CCU dropped its first match of the season on Sunday at UNCW. Freshman Kristina Fisher scored the lone goal in the match. She has now scored the last three goals for CCU, including the game-winner against Appalachian State on 9/1. Goalkeeper Candace Doten is off to a fast start. She has stopped 25 shots so far and has allowed only four goals (1.01 GAA).

**PHOENIX BUCKS THE RIDER**--The Phoenix opened the 2002 season with an impressive 5-2 victory over Rider. Jessica Mills opened the season with two assists while Kate Schabo

notched a hat-trick. In her two games in net, Kara Zagol has tallied 12 saves. The victory over the Broncs avenged a 2-1 double overtime loss from last season. The meeting with Wake Forest was also the second-ever meeting between the two squads.

**YOUTH MOVEMENT**--Freshmen have scored five of High Point's six goals so far this season. Junior Emily Lanham is the only non-newcomer to find the net for the Panthers.

**SCORE NO MORE**--The Lady Flames have started 0-3 for the first time since 1993. In those three losses, Liberty was shut out in every contest, the first time a Flame squad has gone scoreless in three consecutive contests since 1998.

**OUTGUNNING THE COMPETITION**--Two of RU's three game-winning goals have come from freshmen. The Highlanders have outshot their opponents in all four games 60-19, allowing only 4.8 per match.

**BULLDOGS TOP CAMELS**--UNCA picked up its first win in impressive fashion with a 4-2 home victory over Campbell Saturday afternoon. Junior forward Kelsey Dawson led the Bulldog attack with three goals. Freshman Hilary McKay and sophomore Olivia Korman added two assists in the victory.
