Schools and Department of Psychology's Center for Assessment and Psychological Services.
Radford University Psychology Department and the Center for Assessment and Psychological Services (CAPS) partnered with Montgomery County Public Schools (MCPS) in a project to improve the mental and behavioral health of high school students. The arrangement between the partners allowed indirect and direct mental/ behavioral health services to be delivered by CAPS staff for any high school student or high school parent wanting to improve these skill sets. Two types of services were delivered: 1.
MCPS high school students (up to 50) received *individual* Executive Function (EF) coaching services directed toward developing EF skill sets, and 2. MCPS high school parents (up to 30 for each workshop) received 2 *group* parent training workshops in spring and 2 in fall to assist them in improving their teenager's EF skill sets. The aim of this project is to target the improvement of EF skill sets with high school students to increase students' academic success during high school, as well as provide students with transferable skills for college and career. Direct costs: \$13,000; Funded

King Grant Project: "Utilizing Diagnostic Assessment Measures to Improve Treatment" 2018 Co-PI with Elizabeth Cottrell, 3rd year PsyD student and Ashley Slagel-Perry, from CHCNRV. Collaboration between the Community Health Center of the New River Valley (CHCNRV) and Radford University Department of Psychology's Center for Assessment and Psychological Services. Radford University Psychology Department and the Center for Assessment and Psychological Services (CAPS) is partnering with the Community Health Center of the New River Valley (CHCNRV) for the proposed project, which ai ms to improve the delivery of mental health services at the CHCNRV. The partnership between CAPS and CHCNRV will provide CHCNRV mental health clinicians with training on four diagnostic assessment measures, as well as clinical consultation on the use of those assessment measures during the six months following the training. Research has demonstrated the importance of diagnostic accuracy, particularly in community health settings, to inform treatment selection (Kashner et al., 2003). The aim of this project is to provide training and consultation on these diagnostic tools to CHCNRV mental health clinicians to increase their diagnostic accuracy, and ultimately provide the most appropriate treatment. Direct costs \$ 7,858.00; Funded.

Clarifying the mechanism at work in these supportive dyads will enable organizations involved with HIV care and treatment to improve the existing interventions and

to develop new interventions to facilitate resilience in the face of AIDS and HIV. The goal of this project is to examine mentor-youth dyads; in a first step pursuing this goal, the PI will develop a measure of adult mentoring to understand the characteristics of effective mentors. Direct costs \$250,000. Not funded.
