ARE YOU PREPARED FOR

FLOODING?

If a flood watch or warning has been issued for your area, be prepared to either shelter in place or evacuate at a moment's notice.



KNOW YOUR TERMS

- WATCH: Floods are possible. "Be Aware!" because conditions are right for flooding to occur in your area.
- WARNINGS: Floods will occur soon, move to higher ground. "Take Action!" because flooding is either happening or will happen shortly.
- FLASH FLOOD WARNING: Flooding is occurring; seek higher ground immediately.
 Listen to local officials.

READINESS TIPS

- DO NOT WALK, SWIM OR DRIVE THROUGH FLOOD WATERS: "When Flooded, Turn Around, Don't Drown!"
 - of fast-moving water can knock you down.
 - 12" of fast-moving water can carry away a small vehicle.
 - 18" of fast-moving water can carry away most large SUVs, vans and trucks.

- STAY OFF BRIDGES OVER FAST-MOVING WATER.
- DEPENDING ON THE TYPE OF FLOODING:
 - Evacuate if told to do so.
 - Move to higher group or a higher floor.
 - Stay where you are.
- FLOOD WATER CAN HIDE DANGERS BELOW THE SURFACE, SUCH AS WASHED OUT ROADWAYS AND DEBRIS.
- IT IS IMPOSSIBLE TO JUDGE THE EXACT DEPTH OF WATER COVERING A ROADWAY OR THE CONDITION OF THE ROAD BELOW THE WATER.
