

Expanding Radford's Reach to Out-of-State Students

Like many institutions, Radford University has seen a significant decrease in student enrollment in recent years and is requesting authority to offer a reduced tuition rate to students living outside of Virginia. Radford University is required by law to charge out-of-state students the full cost of education, and receiving this authority would expand the university's student recruitment efforts, increase the commonwealth's educational attainment and cultivate a workforce that raises the state's economic competitiveness. The university is proud to have a high percentage of in-state undergraduate students (90%) and is the third-most affordable among Virginia's public four-year institutions.

Operating the Artis Center for Adaptive Innovation and Creativity

The Artis Center for Adaptive Innovation and Creativity will change the way students approach interdisciplinary learning at Radford University by bringing the College of Visual and Performing Arts and programs within the Waldron College of Health and Human Services under the same roof. Radford's state-of-the-art, 178,000-square-foot facility is scheduled to open in fall 2024 and will be the largest

academic facility on the university's main campus. The Artis Center will combine the performing arts, problem-solving maker space and health sciences to encourage methods of learning that go beyond what's possible in traditional academic buildings. Funding is requested to appropriately operate and maintain the Artis Center, including utilities, insurance, housekeeping and maintenance supplies, contractual services, ongoing maintenance contracts and equipment. (\$702,000 in FY25, \$600,000 in FY26 and beyond)

Addressing Future Needs at Radford University Carilion

The continued growth of health sciences initiatives in Roanoke offers unique opportunities to provide students with classroom, research and real-world clinical education settings. Radford University Carilion's current space in the Carilion Roanoke Community Hospital allows little flexibility to serve potential academic program and enrollment growth, while future Carilion healthcare capital demands will require reclaiming of current RUC space. In partnership with Virginia Tech and Carilion, Radford University is exploring shared academic and student support space and will be requesting authorization over the next biennium to construct a new Radford University Carilion building as part of the Roanoke Innovation Corridor.
